... *“Ask, Search, Knock!”*

Rev. Will Bowen, pastor of Christ Church Unity in Kansas City, Mo. was fed up with his congregation whining and complaining. So he asked his congregation of 250 members to refrain from complaining, criticizing and gossiping for three weeks. He passed out purple rubber bracelets stamped with the word SPIRIT. Bowen told his congregation that they were to switch the bracelet to their other wrist every time they griped or sniped. Their goal: 21 consecutive days without moving the bracelet. Bowen used a quote from writer Maya Angelou: “If you don’t like something, change it. If you can’t change it, change your attitude. Don’t complain.”

I thought the bracelet idea was a good one and found out that we could receive as many bracelets as we wanted free of charge. I decided to order a bunch of bracelets just for the fun of it because I believe all of us could use a reminder that we are blessed and need not complain as much as we do from time to time. However, a funny thing happened. I placed the order for the bracelets and they never arrived! So guess what I did? I complained about not getting the “no complaint” bracelets! Maybe that was God’s way of telling me that a bracelet alone does not change a person’s attitude! A bracelet can be a reminder but real change has to come from within and with the help of God. Whatever it is you are trying to change about your life know that God is with you and that if you sincerely ask for God’s help God will give you all you need to make the change and supply all your needs.

Jesus put it this way in Matthew’s gospel (Matthew 7:7-8): **“Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened.”**

There’s a phrase that’s been running through my head for several weeks. It goes away, and then returns, making me think about it some more. I find it influencing my planning for our worship services. I suspect the work of this phrase is not yet finished.

Well, enough *about* it—here it is: ***Worship is a contact sport.*** It’s not a spectator sport. Think about how much our society has become spectator-oriented. We watch TV, we go to movies, we go to ball games, we attend concerts—we sit, and watch someone else do the work of expressing, or the work of the game.

Is that how we approach worship? I suspect we often go to a worship service to be a spectator—I know I’m sometimes guilty of that.

But God calls us to be actively involved in worship. Think of the Psalms—how many of them have the phrase “praise Him with. . .?” We can’t praise if we are passive, watching someone else. “Praise” is an active verb. Is it your intention on Sunday/Wednesday to praise, or to watch someone do something?

The word “liturgy” is an oft-criticized word, as representing a dry, formalized, lifeless observance of unchanging ritual. However, at its very root, and as it was intended in the earliest Christian worship, “liturgy” means “the work of the people,” and at its best, that’s exactly what it is.

When we gather to worship, we should be ready to actively praise our Creator, Redeemer, Life-giving Spirit. Let’s always be doing the work of the people of God at that time, in that place.

We would also like to thank everyone who has contributed to the cost of the A/C and Heating systems in both the fellowship hall and sanctuary. As a church we committed \$46,766 towards the project, of which \$16,278 has been received to date. Dave Ramsey Class Update

We had over 25 people from our congregation and community who completed Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University. It was a 13-week course in personal finance and covered topics such as cash flow planning, saving, dumping debt, retirement, college savings, insurance, investments, stewardship, etc. It was an amazing experience for everyone in the class and changed lives. As a class we paid off over \$70,000 in debt (credit cards, car payments, student loans, etc.). The class has agreed that this is something our church should offer on a regular basis. We will have another Dave Ramsey course beginning in January 2008. By the way, this is not one of those "get rich quick" programs. This is a disciplined approach to finances that takes time and commitment.
